Who said you have to be adequate?

In the version of the story I heard, this was the question put by St Theresa of Calcutta to someone who said she felt inadequate as a Christian. In fact, I'd go as far as to say that when each one of us joined the Church we joined an association of the inadequate. This week's accounts from scripture of the call of Isaiah and the call of Peter show that discipleship is nothing to do with adequacy, let alone with ability or talent, qualifications, education, social status or class.

Neither Isaiah nor Peter shows any sign of feeling adequate when God's word calls them. Isaiah's response is, "Woe is me!" Peter's is, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!". Both of them give evidence for their actual *in*adequacy.

Now, bear in mind that neither Isaiah nor Peter has applied to be God's representative, whether as prophet or apostle. Each of them finds himself in this particular situation only for the simple reason that God has **chosen** him. All Christian discipleship, rests on this one thing. We are **chosen and sent**: they are two sides of the same coin of discipleship.

For our part, we have said, "Yes!" to God's call, despite our continuing inadequacy. What we experience, on the Christian journey, is that God supplies what is needed: we are equipped by God's grace. When we doubt this, as we probably often do, we continue to be fed and called again and again, as we stay in touch with how God speaks to us and loves us into life at every turn.

Because ours is a religion that depends on trust in God and not in ourselves, we call it the Christian *faith*.
